This event is designed to give parents an opportunity to work with their children to experience some of the curriculum activities and teaching techniques that are used in class every day. #### Attendance

Please remember that attendance at school is **compulsory** and **very important**. We aim for an attendance rate of 95% for each child; a pupil having just 9.5 days off in an academic year would fall beneath this target. Persistent absence is defined as an attendance rate of 90% or below.

We appreciate that holidays can be cheaper during term time however it is important to weigh up the impact of missed time on your child's education and any other time which they may have had off school due to illness. Pupil attendance will continue to be monitored closely and, in line with our attendance policy, parents will be contacted if their child's attendance falls below acceptable figures.

The school office will shortly be going through the process to secure music provision at St Nicholas for the 2023-24 academic year. #### Google Classroom

On Friday 19th May, we will be launching Google Classroom as our new homework platform and ceasing to use Purple Mash. The children will be introduced to this in school and there will be a video tutorial and information sheet for parents. We are also hosting two drop-in sessions on <u>Monday 22nd and Wednesday 24th May between 9:00am and 10:30am</u> for any parents experiencing issues using the new format.

Until Friday 19th May, homework will continue to be set on Purple Mash.

## Sports' Day

This has been scheduled for Friday 23rd June (weather permitting) and will take place at Braemar Fields which can be accessed via Braemar Drive. KS2 events will take place in the morning and EYFS/KS1 events will take place in the afternoon. More details will follow closer to the time.
