

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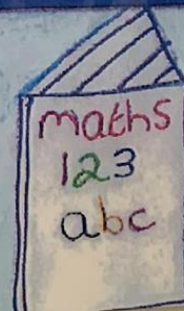

Application process



1. Apply using Birmingham City Council's online application form:

www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions

2. Complete the 'Supplementary Information Form' and return it to the school office.

Both by 15th January deadline.

Key Dates



- 15th January Applications to be submitted.

- 16th April Email notification of offers to parents and letters in post.
- 30th April Closing date for acceptance of school place.



Infant Class Size Limits

- 30 per year group.
- We have no discretion to increase this number in Reception (or Years 1 and 2) because of Infant Class Size legislation.



Key considerations

Oversubscription criteria:

As a Catholic school, priority is given to baptised Catholic children living within the parish.



- The School is usually oversubscribed.
- Sadly, we cannot guarantee a place for every application.
- The number of siblings makes a difference.
- Although we do not yet have details of the number, or category, of applicants for next year, we are aware of the likely number of siblings. Please contact the school office if you would like this information. Although not all of these will necessarily be in parish.

How do we decide if there are more applications than places?



- We apply the oversubscription criteria in the policy.
- We understand that this is a big decision, which school to choose, but everything we do with regards to admissions is set out clearly in our Admissions Policy so please read it carefully.
