This half term we are focusing on living out the Gospel Virtues of **ATTENTIVE & DISCERNING**. Pupils are growing to be attentive to their experience and to their vocation; and discerning about the choices they make and the effects of those choices.

Reading records

We are passionate about every child enjoying reading at St Nicholas and one way that you, as parents and carers, can support this is by ensuring that your child reads at home. Whilst your child is participating in the phonics programme in KS1, they will read their phonics book only and their reading for pleasure book, which they cannot yet read themselves, is for parents/carers to read and enjoy with your child. Once your child finishes the phonics programme, they will bring home a reading book for pleasure that they can read themselves. We have invested lots of time and money into our classroom libraries and each has a selection of books that are varied and age appropriate. Your child should be reading this book every day for at least 15 minutes. Once they have read this, please sign and date their reading record. Their reading record will then be checked by the class teacher. If you have any concerns about your child's reading, please note them in the diary and the class teacher will respond. If your child is not reading at home, teachers will address this with them and, in the first instance, they will be encouraged to find a book that interests them. If the problem persists then parents will be contacted. We hugely appreciate your support with this.

Rudolph Run - raising money for Birmingham Hospice (formerly John Taylor)

As we have done in previous years, we will be supporting the Birmingham Hospice (formerly John Taylor) by taking part in the annual Rudolph Run.

Hettie the Hedgehog has visited the children to introduce the fundraiser and explain how important the money that they raise is in supporting patients in their hospices.

By raising £53 this December, your school could pay for a bereavement support session for someone who has lost a loved one; £157 would cover the cost of an OT home visit to help aid independence or even just £20 will pay for a teddy bear containing a voice recording of a terminally ill person which can be treasured by loved ones when they have died. Let's take the reins and help local families living with a terminal diagnosis, by providing the support they need to have the best Christmas possible!'

We totally understand the financial pressures that this time of year can bring but even a small donation can make a huge difference.

Parent helpers for trips

It would help us greatly if you would wait until a parentmail has gone out asking for help and respond to this; this means that we can keep track of who has offered and we can work within the RA process to ensure that we have the correct number of adults. 


