Parents and carers must be aware of the fact that any member of the public can upload games to this platform and that there is a direct messaging function which can be disabled. ## Administering medications to children during school time

We appreciate that, from time to time, pupils may need medication to be administered by school staff. In an effort to help you keep your child's attendance up, members of school staff (specifically Mrs Nutbrown & Mrs Matthews in the school office) agree to take on the responsibility of giving prescribed medication to children. Please do all that you can to ease the burden on our office staff. You can do this by:

- Ensuring that you have filled in a medications form which you can obtain from the school office. Please be as specific as possible on this form about dosage, timings and storage of medication.
- Making sure that medication has a pharmacy label clearly showing your child's name
- If you are able to come to school to administer medication then please do, so particularly if this needs to be done more than once in the school day

There are quite a few schools in the local area who do not ask their staff to give out medication; they have a rule whereby parents have to come to school to give medication to their own children. We do not want to follow this route as we know that this would be difficult for working parents so please do all that you can to help us in this matter. Thank you.
