





2. Complete the 'Supplementary Information Form' and return it to the school office.

#### **Infant Class Size Limits**



- · 30 per year group.
- We have <u>no discretion</u> to increase this number in Reception (or Years 1 and 2) because of Infant Class Size legislation.



## **Key considerations**

#### Oversubscription criteria:

As a Catholic school, priority is given to baptised Catholic children living within the parish, with a signed Certificate of Catholic Practice from the Parish Priest.



- · The School is usually oversubscribed.
- · The number of siblings makes a difference
- Sadly, we cannot guarantee a place for every application.
- Although we do not yet have details of the number, or category, of applicants, for September 2021, we are aware that there are likely to be at least 14 siblings. Although not all of these will necessarily be in parish.

## How do we decide if there are more applications than places?



- We apply the oversubscription criteria in the policy.
- We understand that this is a big decision, which school to choose, but everything we do with regards to admissions is set out clearly in our Admissions Policy so please read it carefully.
