Jewellery and Hair Accessories

A reminder of the expectations around jewellery and hair accessories. These are extensions of uniform and so should follow the following guidelines:

- Hair accessories (hair bands, alice bands etc) should be plain (nothing stuck on such as flowers) and in school colours which are navy and yellow/gold.
 - We allow pupils to wear one set of stud earnings. Preferably these should be removable for PE but if not, pupils should cover them with micropore tape or plasters.

Bring a birthday book!



For KS2 - Miss Guest recommends...


October, October by Katya Balen
