Remembrance Wall

November is the month of remembrance. This week and or next week, your child will be bringing home a slip of paper on which they (or you) can write the name of a person or group of people who have died and who are to be remembered in our prayers. This may be a loved one, family member or friend or it could be a group of people such as the victims of war or of a specific incident or atrocity.

When your child brings this paper back into school, they will transfer the name from the paper onto a piece of white ribbon (staff in younger year groups will help with the writing). This ribbon will be displayed on our 'Remembrance Wall' which is in the entrance area. When the wall is complete, I will be inviting anyone who wishes to come and have a look and spend a moment of quiet prayer in front of the wall.

If you have any photos of loved ones or orders of service from funerals which you would like to be displayed, please drop them into the school office for the attention of Mrs Noble-Barton.

Haircuts and uniform

As we are now in the second half of the Autumn term, all pupils should be in winter uniform. A reminder that this is:

Grey Trousers
Grey Skirt or Pinafore
Gold Polo Shirt with Logo
Blue Jumper, Sweatshirt or Cardigan with Logo
Dark Socks / Tights (not flesh coloured)

Please ensure that your child's haircut is suitable for school. There have been a few boys in Upper Key Stage 2 sporting 'tram lines' in their hair which is not suitable for school and not in agreement with our uniform policy. Please save these hairstyles for the summer holidays.

To remind you, our uniform policy states:

"...there must be no defined lines or patterns shaved into the hair and any transitions from short hair to longer hair (and vice versa) should be blended in so that no defined lines are created."

Healthy Start Food Vouchers - are you eligible? Do you know anyone who might be?

Despite being eligible, many families in Birmingham are not registering for their Healthy Start food vouchers, entitling them to £4.25 of free food per week. This means thousands of pounds each week worth of free food is not reaching families who need it.

- To qualify for HS applicants must be 10+ weeks pregnant and/or have at least one child under 4 and be in receipt of benefits such as Child Tax Credit or Universal Credit.
- Healthy Start food vouchers can be exchanged for milk, infant formula, fruit, vegetables and pulses.

For KS2 children, Mrs Noble-Barton recommends... Coraline by Neil Gaiman



In Coraline's family's new flat are twenty-one windows and fourteen doors. Thirteen of the doors open and close. The fourteenth is locked, and on the other side is only a brick wall, until the day Coraline unlocks the door to find a passage to another flat in another house just like her own.

Only it's different.

At first, things seem marvellous in the other flat. The food is better. The toy box is filled with wind-up angels that flutter around the bedroom, books whose pictures writhe and crawl and shimmer, little dinosaur skulls that chatter their teeth. But there's another mother, and another father, and they want Coraline to stay with them and be their little girl. They want to change her and never let her go. Other children are trapped there as well, lost souls behind the mirrors. Coraline is their only hope of rescue. She will have to fight with all her wits and all the tools she can find if she is to save the lost children, her ordinary life, and herself.
