During November we pray for the souls of those who have died. We also pray for those who have died or suffered injury through war. Today we celebrated Mass as a school community to pray for the faithful departed.

Year 5 is leading our Poppy Appeal across school to raise money for the Royal British Legion.

On Thursday 11th November the whole school will gather in the hall to join virtually with other schools from our Academy for a service of remembrance taking place at Abbey Catholic School. Some members of our Chaplaincy Team will be attending this service in person.

Term dates - end of summer term 2022

In line with Birmingham City Council, Directors have agreed that, for all schools in the St John Paul II MAC, the last day of the summer term will now be Thursday 21st July 2022, not Friday 22nd July 2022 as previously published. This is due to the additional bank holiday which has been agreed on Friday 3rd June 2022 in celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Our schools will already be on their summer half-term holiday on this day. The additional one day holiday will therefore be taken on Friday 22nd July 2022, meaning that the Summer Term 2022 will now end on Thursday 21st July 2022.

Long hair

Please note that as a health & safety measure we require all pupils with long hair to wear it tied back for school. This applies to both girls and boys. If your child's hair is not long enough to tie back but falls into their face when working, it might be helpful to wear it pushed back from their face.
