Please sign your child's record when they have read with you at home - this doesn't need to be anything more than a date and initial unless you would like to comment on your child's progress or ask a question of their phonics teacher or class teacher.

#### School Photographs - class groups



The Search for the Giant Arctic Jellyfish by Chloe Savage


