Over recent years we have invested time and money into training multiple members of staff in the area of Mental Health First Aid. We offer various support groups in school focused around mental health and well-being as well as working with external agencies and charities who also provide support. One of our after-school clubs is a 'Mindfulness Club' and we have also offered virtual 'drop in' Mental Health and Wellbeing sessions. On a daily basis we are mindful of helping pupils to achieve a 'Growth Mindset' and developing emotional resilience.

Offering pupils the chance to be in the School Council and Chaplaincy Team as well as representing the school in various events also contributes towards pupils' personal development.

Will there be an opportunity to learn a language in future years other than extra curricular classes?	Yes, all pupils in KS2 classes participate in French lessons every week taught by a French specialist teacher from Bishop Walsh.

P.E. is 'dropped' to teach RSHE.	RSHE is a statutory part of the curriculum and must be taught. We teach this in three 'block weeks' per year. We aim to ensure that during an RSHE week we still teach English, Maths, RE and PE.
