Instrument of Government Ethos Statement

- Support their child with homework and other opportunities for home learning.
- Attend parents' evenings and discussions about their child's progress
- Get to know about their child's life at school.
- Endeavour to take holidays in school holiday time.
- Keep the school informed about any concerns or problems (medical, physical or emotional difficulties) that might affect their child's work or behaviour.
- Support their child to access school's Remote Learning provision.
